Both affectionate homage and biting satire, GREATER TUNA presents a portrait of Texas' "third smallest town." Two men take on 20 roles in a hilarious blur of costume changes, encompassing everyone from a depressed wannabe cheerleader to the owner of a used weapons store to the President of the Smut Snatchers of the New Order. Their lives feed the news on Tuna's local radio station, OKKK.

Didi Snavelly: owner of Didi's Used Weapons

Harold Dean Lattimer: weatherman for OKKK

Petey Fisk: employee of the Greater Tuna Humane Society

Jody Bumiller: youngest child of Bertha, constantly followed by a pack of dogs

Stanley Bumiller: Charlene's twin, fresh from reform school; murderer of local judge

Charlene Bumiller: daughter of Hank and Bertha, depressed after failing to become a cheerleader

Chad Hartford: Houston reporter who comes to interview Bertha

Phinas Blye: politician from Indiana who runs for City Council every election
